THE HOLY SPIRIT 12 - 16 July



Dean and Professor of Biblical and Systematic Theology, Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, Chicago

Prof Cole served in two Australian churches and lectured at Moore Theological College and The University of Sydney before becoming Principal of Ridley College in 1992. From 2002 he was Professor of Biblical and Systematic Theology at TEDS Chicago until 2011 when he was invited to become the Anglican Professor of Divinity at Beeson Divinity School, Samford University in Birmingham, Alabama. In 2015 he moved back to TEDS to become Dean. Among his many published works are *He Who Gives Life, Engaging with the Holy Spirit* and *Faithful Theology: An Introduction.*





GOSPEL SPIRITUALITY FOR LEADERSHIP:

11 February, 4 and 25 March, 29 April, 20 May

This unit explores how the gospel of Jesus Christ is the driving force for discipleship and ministry. Drawing on Scripture, as well as the insights of theologians from Augustine to Timothy Keller, this subject will enable Christian leaders to develop a comprehensive model for gospel centred ministry.

LEADING IN CONTEXTUAL MISSION:

22 July, 12 August, 2 and 23 September, 14 October

This unit seeks to equip church leaders for mission to our post-Christendom culture. The specific topics include: understanding culture biblically and theologically; contextualisation of our message and ministry; missional ecclesiology; evangelistic networking; and, mobilising others in mission.

CHURCH SYSTEMS AND CONGREGATIONAL HEALTH: 12 - 16 April

This unit helps us to understand the dynamics of church life and culture that are often hard to detect for pastors who are deeply embedded within their congregations and traditions. The capacity to analyse congregational systems is critical for leaders who want to drive change and oversee new seasons of positive gospel growth within their churches.
