



# APPLYING TO STUDY AT BIBLE COLLEGE SA

## So you're interested in studying with us as Bible College SA? Great! Here is what the process normally looks like.

1. Most prospective students come to one of our Open Day / Open Evening events. They happen in May and October every year and are a great opportunity to hear about the College, our aims, values, study options etc. and to ask any questions of the staff or faculty. Try to make it to one of these if you can.
2. Read the **"Apply"** page on our website. Here you will find important information about our key admission requirements. These requirements are for **all** students: those applying to study for credit, those who wish to audit, and those applying for cross-institutional study. If you decide to make an application, you will need to agree fully with our **Statement of Faith** so you should read it at this stage. Feel free to get in touch with our Academic Administrator, Dr Chris Seglenieks (seglenieks@biblecollege.sa.edu.au) if you have any questions prior to starting a formal application.
3. Complete the formal application on our website. It is the black button at the bottom of the "apply" page. Please ensure you allow 3-4 weeks for your application to be processed prior to the start of the semester you wish to begin. If you wish to enroll for study at the beginning of the year, please aim to submit your application by November/early December of the year before. Please note College staff take leave over Christmas and early January.
4. Once we have received your application, you will be invited to an interview with the Deans of Students. This is an in-person interview that takes place on campus during College business hours. It normally takes about one hour. In it we discuss your Christian journey, your hopes and goals in studying at Bible College, and our key values as a College. You may be asked to take an academic suitability test if your application has raised concerns about your academic ability. If necessary, this test would occur on the same day as your interview.
5. You will hear back from us within a couple of weeks. If the Principal approves a place for you, you will receive a Letter of Offer from our Academic Administrator. This letter includes a link to the Enrolment Form that allows you to enroll in the various units of study you wish to take.
6. Fill out your enrolment form.
7. Come to the orientation evening at the start of your first semester.
